The Bethesda Home Friendship Meal program provides noon meals 5 days a week to elderly men and women of the community who are either disabled, home-bound due to illness or injury, and widow and/or widowers. This \$1,000 grant was used to supplement the cost of the delivery-meal program. Community volunteers load their vehicle and deliver nutritious meals.



The Goessel Public Library received a \$500 grant. Books related to STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics) were read as story time material. Snack and drinks were provided to children in attendance (including freeze dried fruits - just like the astronauts!). STEM projects were made or kits (Motion, Magnets, Robots, Solar, and Electricity) were explored during Thursday's STEAM ASP @ the Library.

Marion County Fire District #2 received a \$500 grant to supplement the cost of new radios. These six volunteers are only a few from all over the community who are "on-call" at all times.



A \$420 grant to Heart to Heart Child Advocacy Center who serves the Goessel area. This grant was used to purchase four anatomically correct dolls that are used during forensic interviews to help children identify and communicate traumatic and harmful experiences.
